Q182: How does the Spirit help us to pray?

A182: Because we do not know for what to pray as we ought, the Spirit helps our weaknesses, by enabling us to understand both for whom and what, and how prayer is to be made; and by working and making alive in our hearts (although not in all persons, nor at all times in the same measure) those understandings, affections and graces that are necessary for the right performance of that duty.
